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Abstract

This document is the Deliverable "D 7.1. Summary report and conclusions of the Training session for Competent Authorities to better implement the new GES decision" of the QUIETMED2 project funded by the DG Environment of the European Commission within the call "DG ENV/MSFD 2018 call". This call funds projects to support the implementation of the second cycle of the Marine Strategy Framework Directive (2008/56/EC) (hereinafter referred to as MSFD), in particular to implement the new GES Decision (Commission Decision (EU) 2017/848 of 17 May 2017 laying down criteria and methodological standards on good environmental status of marine waters and specifications and standardised methods for monitoring and assessment, and repealing Decision 2010/477/EU) and Programmes of Measures according Article 13 of the MSFD. The QUIETMED2 project aims to support Member States Competent Authorities in the Assessment of the extent to which GES on Descriptor 11-Underwater noise has been achieved in the Mediterranean Region by providing practical outcomes to implement the new GES Decision through: i) a joint proposal of a candidate for an impulsive noise indicator in the Mediterranean Region ii) a common methodology for Competent Authorities to establish thresholds values, together with associated lists of elements and integration rules, iii) a data and information tool to support the implementation of the monitoring programmes of impact of impulsive noise based on the current ACCOBAMS joint register which will be demonstrated on iv) an operational pilot of the tool and v) several activities to boost current regional cooperation efforts of Barcelona Convention developing new Mediterranean Region cooperation measures.

This document reports the development of the first two training sessions, for Competent Authorities from EU and non EU countries, planned in the QUIETMED2 project, focused on how to better manage underwater noise pollution in the Mediterranean Region. The different sections of this report set out the contents of the sessions, the general information on attendees, the feedback received by the participants and the main conclusions and recommendations extracted of this workshop training.

1. Introduction


The QUIETMED2 Project is funded by DG Environment of the European Commission within the call "DG ENV/MSFD Second Cycle/2018". This call funds the next phase of MSFD implementation, in particular, to implement the new GES Decision (Commission Decision (EU) 2017/848 of 17 May 2017 laying down criteria and methodological standards on good environmental status of marine waters and specifications and standardised methods for monitoring and assessment, and repealing Decision 2010/477/EU) and Programmes of Measures according Article 13 of the MSFD.

The QUIETMED2 project aims to enhance cooperation among Member States (MS) in the Mediterranean Sea Region (MED) to implement the Second Cycle of the Marine Directive and in particular to assist them in the preparation of their MSFD reports through the following specific objectives:

- Develop and implement a candidate impact indicator in the Mediterranean Region for D11C1 Criteria.
- Make a joint proposal of a methodology to establish threshold values, list of elements and integration rules to implement the GES decision in reference to D11 in the Mediterranean Region.
- Build an efficient data and information tool to support the implementation of the D11C1 Criteria and the update of the monitoring programmes of Impulsive Noise according the new GES Decision.
- Perform an operational pilot of an impulsive noise impact monitoring programme implemented with the updated Joint register to demonstrate its feasibility.
- Promote Mediterranean Region Coordination by i) boosting current regional cooperation efforts of Barcelona Convention and others and ii) developing new cooperation measures.
- Enhance collaboration among a wide network of stakeholders through the dissemination of the project results, knowledge share and networking.

To achieve its objectives, the project is divided in 3 work packages around 3 priorities and 10 activities whose relationships are shown in Figure 1.





The project is developed by a consortium made up of 11 entities coordinated by CTN and it has a duration of 24 months starting on February 2019.

This document reports the development and main conclusions of the first training session for Competent Authorities celebrated in Barcelona from 7th to 8th December 2019 in the context of the World Marine Mammal Conference 2019 (WMM19').



2. Workshop-training session contents.

The 2 Days "Training session to better manage underwater noise pollution in the Mediterranean Region" was performed in Barcelona on 7th and 8th December 2019.

This training workshop focused on supporting Competent Authorities (CA) to implement the Marine Strategy Framework Directive (MSFD) in terms of Descriptor D11 (on underwater noise) and aim to improve the cooperation with the Barcelona Convention in the framework of the EcAp process.

The aim of this training workshop wasis to support the assessment of Good Environmental Status (GES) according to the new GES decision¹ with regards to underwater noise pollution (Descriptor 11 of the EU Marine Strategy Framework Directive) in the Mediterranean Region through the main actions detailed below:

- Presentation of and training on the ACCOBAMS International Impulsive Noise Register for the Mediterranean Sea Region.
- Review of the GES assessment and presentation of existing approaches and solutions for the management of underwater noise pollution impacting marine biodiversity.

The specific objectives of this training workshop were:

- To disseminate the ACCOBAMS International Impulsive Noise Register (http://80.73.144.60/CTN_Geoportal/home/), a tool for marine noise pollution management and mitigation and describe the potential of this tool for marine biodiversity conservation;
- to raise awareness of the issue of underwater noise and, in particular, the register and GES assessment (Art 9 of the EU Marine Strategy Framework Directive);
- to provide technical support to competent authorities from MS to better manage noise-producing human activities;
- to boost cooperation among EU Member-States and improve the cooperation and coordination with the Ecosystem Approach (EcAp process) of the Barcelona Convention by encouraging an active participation of non-EU representatives to the workshop.



The first day of this training workshop was developed as an affiliated workshop in the World Marine Mammal Conference 2019 (WMMC¹⁹).

3. Workshop-training session development -in brief

The procedure followed for the development of this training workshop was based on series of speakers followed by joint discussions and a practical training session on the use of the ACCOBAMS International Impulsive Noise Register for the Mediterranean Sea Region.

3.1. Workshop to support the implementation of the marine Strategy Framework according the new GES decision

3.1.1. Underwater noise issue in the MSFD and the EcAp process

This introductory session provided an overview of the background and current status of the Ecosystem Approach (EcAp) with regards to underwater noise.

The **EcAp initiative** is the guiding principle to the policy implementation and development undertaken under UNEP/MAP-Barcelona Convention with the ultimate objective of achieving the Good Environmental Status (GES) of the Mediterranean Sea and Coast.

For the implementation of the EcAp to the management of human activities that may affect the Mediterranean marine and coastal environment (Decision 17/6-COP17,2012) was agreed the development of a set of ecological objectives (EO) corresponding to the vision and strategic goals.

The **Ecological Objective 11** (EO 11): Energy inputs into the marine environment, especially noise from human activities is minimized was set and the associated indicators for impulsive and continuous noise are currently considered as Candidate Indicators.

During the session the following were highlighted:

- The **synergy and coherence** of the EcAp process with the implementation of the European Union (EU) Marine Strategy Framework Directive (MSFD).
- The important **progress achieved** in the implementation of EO11 **based on EUfunded project** QUIETMED and ongoing QUIETMED2: new Guidance Factsheets have been prepared by ACCOBAMS;
- New Guidance Factsheets have been considered by the Meetings of CorMon on Pollution Monitoring and MED POL Focal Points meetings, indicating a need for further work to gather relevant knowledge, prior to incorporating them into IMAP upon completion of its initial phase.

3.1.2. Impulsive sound and GES assessment

During this session, the preliminary contents of a **specific guidance addressed to competent authorities from MS to better implement the new GES decision** was presented. This guidance is going to be developed in the framework of the QUIETMED2 project (Deliverable 7.2).



This guidance is mainly based on the assessment of the GES definition regarding D11 (Art.9), for each MS (in the Mediterranean Sea Region), considering the new Commission Decision (EU) 2017/848, though:

- Comparing the results from the review done in QUIETMED (Comm. Dec. 2010/477/EU) with the updated definitions after the first cycle of implementation the MSFD, considering the new Commission Decision 2017/848.
 - 50% of the countries in the MED Region have provided updated National definition of GES for D11 considering the new Commission Decision.
 - Most of the definitions are "pressured-level", based on the wording of the MSFD Directive, while only France provides a "risk-based definition", based on the identification of risks either at generic level or expressed as specific issues. No "response-based" definitions have been identified in the MED Region (definitions which include the regulation of noise generating activities).
- Identifying difficulties for moving forward with the GES definitions for D11 considering the new Commission Decision 2017/848. Some preliminary difficulties were identified as follow:
 - Due to lack of threshold values, the GES definition is currently aligned with the definition established by new Com Dec 2017/848 for the criteria of this descriptor.
 - Insufficient level of information/data available about the effects of increased ambient noise levels makes difficult to decide the type of approach for target setting and description of GES in common with the other Mediterranean EU MS (MED CAM, 2014b).
 - Limited information about the effect of noise on marine species different than marine mammals (GES can be adapted with updated advances in the knowledge about the impact of noise on the marine environment).

3.1.3. Establishments of thresholds. National barriers and difficulties

During this session, the difficulties and barriers found by the MSFD implementation decision-makers to set thresholds values regarding underwater noise were discussed. Main questions raised during this session are pointed below:

- MS have disparities among definition of threshold values: pressure-based and risk-based. No response-based definition were identified.
- New Commission decision (2017/848/EU) requires risk-based approach.
- Experience from Germany with respect to avoiding harm to harbour porpoises from pile driving activities could be a reference example for the rest of the countries.
- TG Noise proposes either a species habitat or a habitat approach. Both approaches require strong effort in transnational cooperation among MS.
- OSPAR methodology is somewhat difficult to apply in the Mediterranean as the Mediterranean is heterogeneous with variable topography.



- The methodology to set threshold values (TVs) should be dynamic process able to integrate new knowledge.
- Implementation of the Impulsive Noise Register constitutes key element for the assessment of the impacted habitat.
- There is a lack of legal obligation from the Mediterranean states to submit data on impulsive noise.

3.1.4. National barriers and difficulties to collect D11 information

The difficulties to collect information on impulsive sound generating activities is one recurrent issue raised in most of the discussions during the training workshop. In this sense, it is particularly noteworthy that the availability (for MSFD national responsible) of data at national level is conditioned to:

- the existence of legal obligations to provide information from Companies (or entities) that conduct activities producing (or potentially producing) underwater noise.
- the coordination among different Ministries, and/or entities involved in the process of permitting activities (industry, environmental agencies, scientists) and MSFD implementation.

This lack of noise data availability at national level results in obvious gaps of information at subregional and regional level, making the GES assessment impossible at MED level. In this sense, it was highlighted:

- The absence of an obligation for MS of the Mediterranean area to report noise information into the INR-MED.
- The INR-MED can be used as a guidance tool for MS to develop the most suitable tool for data collection.

As a good practice exercise and boosting cooperation example, ACCOBAMS explained the recent workshop performed in Toulon, France, in October 2019, inviting NATO and National Navies with the aim to show how the ACCOBAMS Scientific Committee can provide advice and assistance with respect to mitigating adverse effects on cetaceans for any future exercises ². Only Italian and French navies responded to the invitation.

Greece and Spain updated the information about contact points of their navies, while the issue of participation of navies in the implementation of the noise register was also discussed by representatives from the Southern Med countries.

The intention of ACCOBAMS to organize a next workshop with the participation of national navies was expressed, and Fabrizio Borsani (TG Noise) noted that a coordinated joint action from TG Noise and ACCOBAMS is needed to raise awareness to the navies about the benefits of their active involvement.

ACCOBAMS and SPA/RAC also announced a forthcoming Biennial Conference for Southern Mediterranean countries in October 2020 aiming at exchange information and experiences on cetacean study, monitoring and conservation. he needs of this conference were discussed In order to raise awareness and promote the Quiet MED 2 project among decision makers and the focal points of ACCOBAMS, SPA/RAC, MEDPOL.

An important need resulted from the discussion, not only for the Southern Med countries but also for all the organizations implementing MSFD and contacting the data providers (services, authorities, industrial parties, etc.), was the setup of an as-simple-as-possible and compact factsheet with the following information:

- A simple definition of underwater noise as a pollution factor for the marine life.
- A statement that underwater noise can have an adverse impact on marine animals, not only marine mammals but also commercial species from fishes and invertebrate categories.
- The context/framework within which the information is requested.
- The organizations that will receive the information and the level of confidentiality with respect to each provider.
- Basic parameters necessary to be provided such as coordinates and start/end dates.

This factsheet will act as a primary information sheet for the data providers.

In the aforementioned discussion, the following issues were mentioned by the Southern Med countries:

- Apart from seismic survey data from oil and gas industry, similar data from surveys for research purposes should also be identified and gathered by contacting universities or/and organizations who conduct such surveys.
- The importance of the noise register and the national needs to implement it.
- Mitigation measures.

Finally, Florent Le Courtois from SHOM presented the France register of impulsive noise "SIRENE" as an example of implementation of national register. Main conclusions of this presentation were:

- Data exists since activities exists.
- It is essential to identify sources of information and contact point(s).
- Information required is related to Where? When? How much?
- No need for high spatial and temporal accuracy.
- Setting methodology to collect data can be a complicated procedure.
- The data collection itself is usually an easy but, most of the times, boring procedure.
- Only data of high confidence should by registered, then, a quality process is required to recover the information.



3.1.5. National barriers and difficulties to collect D1 information

Although the availability of biodiversity data, mainly related to cetacean populations was not considered as critical as the noise data availability, some points were remarked with regards to the data collection:

- One problem is that observations are held mainly by NGOs and not by • competent authorities.
- Need to investigate available data portals.
- There are already national networks established among the southern Mediterranean countries for the monitoring of biodiversity.

3.2. Training session on the use of the ACCOBAMS International Impulsive Noise Register for the Mediterranean Sea Region

The training session was based on performing a practical exercise on the use of the International Impulsive Noise Register for the Mediterranean Sea Region (INR-MED) using two hypothetical cases of permit request to develop potential noise generating activities.

In the first case, all the participants performed a joint guided exercise to upload noise data into the register. In the second part of the training, the participants followed the same procedure by themselves with a different test case. In this case, the participants were divided into groups formed by QUIETMED 2 consortium members together with national representatives to facilitate that the QM2 members provided them technical support during the development of this second exercise.

During this exercise, the participants were able to:

- Acquaint themselves with information on activities with potential generation of • impulsive noise.
 - Identify information related to impulsive sound from a hypothetical example form of permit application to develop impulsive sound generation activities.
 - Detect key information needed for data submission into the INR-MED
- Use the INR-MED GIS tool through a practical user's experience.
 - Having a better knowledge of the different functionalities available into the tool.
 - Downloading the noise template (excel format) available into the tool used to feed the register.
 - Filling the noise data template provided by the INR-MED with the key information extracted previously.
 - Converting the fulfilled file to the appropriate format (.csv) to submit the data.
 - Uploading the data into the tool.
 - Visualizing the data uploaded in the map.
 - Testing the functionalities associated to the data analysis.



Most of the users registered during the exercise (11 of 15) were able to submit the noise data successfully by themselves.

To perform this exercise, temporary user accounts were created to allow the participants to play with the tool. These accounts were invalidated once the exercise was finalized, as well as the noise data test submitted during the exercise.

The supporting materials to develop this practical exercise are included as Annex III at the end of this document.

4. Conclusions and recommendations

At the end of the training workshop, an evaluation survey was distributed among the participants. The feedback received through the **21 evaluation surveys** can be found below.

The table 2 summarize the general overview from the participants regarding the development of the training workshop:

In addition to the previous item scores, the participants were asked about positive and negative aspects to take into consideration.

Regarding the positive aspects, it was stressed:

- Interesting and useful knowledge provided during the sessions.
- Competences gained.
- Strategic project outcomes in the framework of MSFD but also in the framework of the whole region (UNEP/MAP+ACCOBAMS).
- International cooperation.
- Exchange of information and methodologies.
- Steps to move forward the implementation on D11
- Coordination with ACCOBAMS and SPA/RAC.
- Good spirit of cooperation.



- High presence of competent authorities (EU and non EU).
- Participation of southern MED States.
- Performance in the context of the WMMC 19.

On the other hand, some negative aspects were pointed:

- Many presentations.
- Change of venue.
- Dynamic of discussions.
- Extended prior information.
- Short time.

Also, the participants made some comments and suggestions related to the need: to continue organizing common events for the future; to be informed on the next project outcomes; to look for synergies between D1 and D11 regarding searching and gathering data, and oceanographic campaigns to be done; and to take into consideration representatives of noise production activities.

Attending to the results of the evaluation surveys and the comments received it seems to be clear that:

- In view of the high participation, activities for boosting cooperation among all the countries in the MED are highly welcomed by EU and non EU countries.
- Capacity building in noise technical issues and management has been detected as a priority.
- EU projects funded to support the MSFD implementation may provide practical outcomes to strength synergies among the MSFD and the EcAp process implementation.
- Connection between D1 and D11 should be considered for the future. This is in accordance to the statement of the Com Dec (EU) 2017/848 "The outcomes of these criteria shall also contribute to assessments under Descriptor 1", as mentioned in the Methodological standards of Descriptor 11.

5. Dissemination of results

The outputs of this workshop will be used to: finalize the Specific Guidance addressed to competent authorities to better manage noise-producing human activities; ensure the use of the ACCOBAMS International Impulsive Noise Register for the Mediterranean Sea Region, including a roadmap for submitting data.

Workshop results will be disseminated through the QUIETMED2 website (https://quietmed2.eu/) and social networks. Outputs will be presented to all other relevant meetings (TG Noise, ACCOBAMS Scientific Committee, etc.), and will be the basis of the second training session planed in 2020 in order to ensure relevant coordinated measures at Mediterranean level by providing technical support.
